

Challenge by Choice

What is it?

Choices for review activities for students based on areas of need as determined by self-assessment or teacher's assessment

Basic model guidelines:

- If you have a review packet, you may need to modify it into content sections
- Ensure the review packet is arranged in sections by concept/skill
- Provide students with a simple self-assessment that covers each of the skills in the review packet
- Students who identify areas of weaknesses on the formative assessment may begin
 working on sections of the review that align with their identified areas of weakness
 (choosing by readiness)
- Students who identify zero weaknesses on the formative assessment may choose to begin with any section of the packet (choosing by interest)

Critical Attributes

- Based on prior assessment and, when possible, student self-assessment
- Offers students choice on how to spend time reviewing for a test/quiz based on their greatest area(s) of need
- · Engages students at the correct level of difficulty

Why use it?

- Provides students with an opportunity to spend review time on their greatest area of needs
- Allows students choice, promoting motivation and engagement

What are the guidelines for successfully implementing this strategy?

- Model how to self-assess; provide specific criteria for self-assessment
- Provide clear instructions for each of the activities in the review
- Provide Anchor activities for students who may finish the review early
 - Ex: "Study on your own by writing and answering an essay question you think may be on the test."
 - Ex: "Create flashcards for terms from the review packet that you can use to study tonight."
