Winter of Red Snow RAFT

After reading *Winter of Red Snow*, I gave students a formative assessment to determine their current level of understanding. Based on the results of the assessment, I divided the student into 5 groups. When entering class the next day, they were each assigned to a specific group to complete their RAFT. Each group was assigned a person/role.

Martha Washington	Classmates	Quilt/ Paragraphs	Create a quilt with at least 4 patches that represent Martha and her time at V.F. Write 1 paragraph explaining each.
George Washington	soldiers	speech	1 page speech motivating your soldiers. Address the difficulties you have overcome and why it is vital to keep fighting.
Lucy	yourself	Journal Entry	Describe why you cut your hair and explain what you learned from it. (1 page minimum)
